Jindalee is situated on the southern side of the Brisbane River, 7½ miles from the City Hall. From the City, follow Coronation Drive or Milton Road to Moggill Road. Follow the signs along Moggill Road and turn left at the Jindalee/ Fig Tree Pocket sign near the Salvation Army Boys' Home, Indooroopilly. Follow the express-way over the Centenary Bridge to Jindalee.

From Oxley, cross the rail bridge and follow the signs to Jindalee.

EDITORIAL

In place of the usual editorial notes we are setting out the details of a press release from the Queensland Branch of the Boy Scouts' Association.

8TH AUSTRALIAN JAMBOREE 28th December 1967 to 6th January 1968

Due to factors beyond the control of the Boy Scouts' Association, Queensland Branch, it has been found necessary to change the site of the 8th Australian Jamboree, to be held in Queensland, between 28th December 1967 and 6th January 1968. With the co-operation and generosity of Centenary Estates Limited, a new site of 450 acres has been made available by the Company at Jindalee. This national gathering will be known as the "Jindalee Jamboree".

The area adjoins one of Brisbane's newest suburbs, and though only 7 miles from the Brisbane G.P.O. still retains a beautiful bushland setting. The site is readily accessible via Moggill Road, and the bridge recently constructed across the Brisbane River by Centenary Estates Limited, or via Wacol and Oxley on the south side of Brisbane.

On this site the Boy Scouts' Association will be hosts to 12,000 Scouts from all over Australia, and many overseas countries. A Brotherhood Fund of 50 cents paid by every Australian Scout attending the Jamboree will be used to assist Scouts from many Eastern countries to attend.

Beside the normal activities of a Jamboree, of camping, fraternising, "Swopping" and tests of Scouting skills, the Jamboree will be open to the public on many occasions, to witness interesting arena displays, camp fires and other activities by inter-state and overseas contingents.

The guest of honour for the duration of the Jamboree will be Sir Charles Maclean, Bart., Chief Scout of the Commonwealth. He will come from the United Kingdom specially for the event.
