## Top Orchestra comes to Brisbane

The Australian Chamber Orchestra, has since its inception in 1975 won the reputation for being one of the country's most consistently successful ensembles.

Under the direction of violinist/conductor John Harding the Orchestra with David Pereira on cello and Irene Morozov on viola will be performing at Mayne Hall, St. Lucia on Friday March 13 at 8.15 p.m. Selections will be performed from composers such as Corelli, Tippett, Hindemith and Britten. The concert will be the first in Musica Viva's 1981 International Series.

Although the Orchestra performs typically as a conductorless ensemble it has worked with several distinguished conductors including Neville Marriner and Sir David Willcocks and overseas soloists such as Christopher Hogwood, Yehudi and Hephzibah Menuhin and Felix Ayo.

The Orchestra has toured overseas twice visiting countries such as Indonesia, Singapore, Hong Kong, Malaysia, Thailand, Japan, Korea and the Phillipines. In 1981 the Orchestra will undertake its premier tour of New Zealand, in 1982 it will tour Europe and in 1983 the U.S.A.

The Orchestra has given 123 concerts for Musica Viva and in 1981 will undertake over twenty concerts for Musica Viva including the major subscription series in Brisbane, Sydney, Canberra, Melbourne, Adelaide and its first appearance in Perth.
