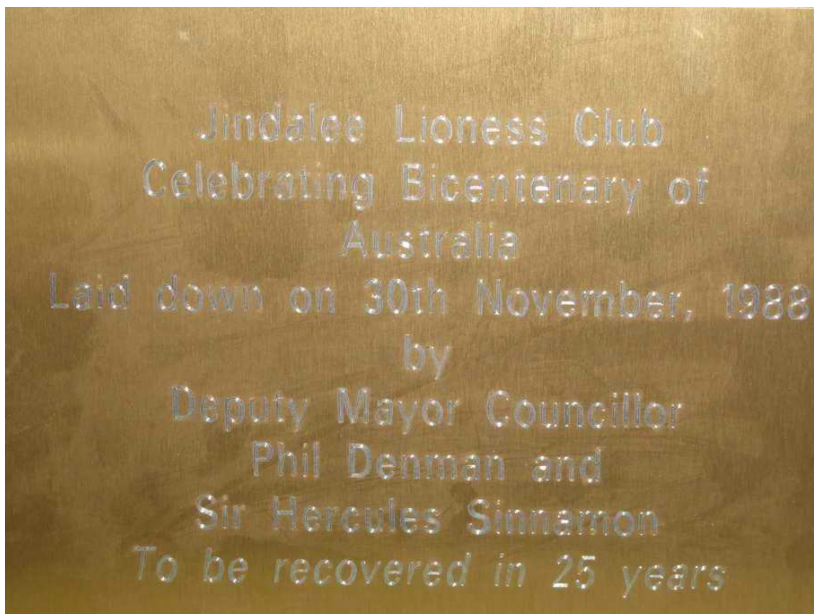


Time Capsule Opened



In 1988 to celebrate Australia's Bicentennial, the then Jindalee Lioness Club buried a time capsule cylinder which contained information relevant to the club.

The cylinder was laid down in the 'Centenary Shopping Centre' by the then Deputy Mayor, Alderman Phil Denman and well-known local resident Sir Hercules Sinnamon.

25 years later, the cylinder was dug up and the Jindalee Lions Club celebrated that occasion with past members of the Lioness Club, elected representatives and members of the Centenary Suburbs Historical Society.

This occurred on Friday 22nd November 2013 at Mount Ommaney Shopping Centre and was again supported by the management of the Centre.



Four members of our Society attended to witness the revealing of the enclosed documents - a step back into the past.

As it was a Bicentennial Project of the Lioness Club, the contents revealed the extent of the history of the 1988 celebrations - photographs, newsletters, Expo 88 memorabilia, 1988 Australian postage stamps, and newspaper cuttings.

President Glenda Haig and Past President Irene Dunning organised the unveiling and the Mount Ommaney Shopping Centre assisted with digging up the capsule and providing a lovely morning tea at the Centenary Community Hub.
