Hugh White Place, corner Furness Cres. and Sinnamon Road, Sinnamon Park



A section of the parkland in Windermere Estate has recently been named Hugh White Place. This commemorates Hugh and Sarah White who had a farm and raised their family in the area during the 1920s and 1930s.

In response to Councillor Matthew Bourke inviting the community to make submissions about the name of the park in Windermere Estate that is bordered by Windermere Road, the Centenary Suburbs Historical Society proposed that it be called Hugh White Park. The Council decision was that the whole park be named Thomas Macleod Park in recognition of the pioneering aviation flight by Thomas Macleod (a plaque commemorating this is installed in the park). However, the Council also decided to name an area within the park Hugh White Place. The selected area is part of the land owned by Hugh White during the 1920s and 1930s.
