

Sinnamon Memorial Uniting Church Final Service



The Sinnamon Memorial Uniting Church held its final service, after 137 years, on Sunday 13th March 2016 at 2pm, led by Rev. David Pitman. The State Heritage-listed Church, built in 1888, is one of only four original 19th century buildings surviving in the district. When the Church had to be moved from its original position on the corner of Goggs Road and Seventeen Mile Rocks Road, Sir Hercules Sinnamon ensured its preservation by donating a small part of his farmland (the current location on Seventeen Mile Rocks Road) for its relocation. The Centenary Suburbs Historical Society supports the preservation of this historic heritage-listed building in the local area and will be inquiring from the Uniting Church about its plans for the building.
