# JINDALEE

Parish - Oxley, County- Stanley.

**(established - September 1962 – 1st Centenary suburb)**

Originally named by Queensland Place Names Board on 21 November 1963.

Name and boundaries confirmed by Minister for Survey and Valuation, Urban and Regional Affairs on 11 August 1975.

## **Suburb name**

Jindalee is an (imported) Aboriginal word from New South Wales, language and dialect unknown, supposed to indicate “bare hills” or “skin and bone”.

Jindalee is bordered by the Brisbane River to the north and west, by the Centenary Highway to the east and Mt Ommaney to the south.

## **History**

Until 1959 the general area was in the hands of 170 individual land owners and most of it was farming land.

Located on the outskirts of Brisbane, Jindalee was an experiment in large scale development which succeeded. It was developed as Centenary Estates by L J Hooker - named ‘Centenary’ to coincide with Queensland’s Centenary year.

Jindivick Street	Aboriginal word “jindivik” meaning “burst asunder” ( <i>BCC Archives</i> )
Jirrah Street	Maybe from Aboriginal word “jirra” meaning “kangaroo” or “dilly” (bag for holding possessions usually made of grass, cord or fur although dilly means bag, usual term is dilly bag). Dilly was originally fine wood dust, and the dilly bag was used to carry sticks and tinder for firemaking, and the term extended to other bags ( <i>A.W. Reed</i> ) <b>or</b> “kangaroo” ( <i>S.E. Endacott, Grandpa Pencil - online</i> ) <b>or</b> “jirra” meaning “turkey quail” ( <i>J. H. Sugden</i> )
Jumbuck Street	Aboriginal word for “sheep”, a corruption of “jombock” ( <i>A.W. Reed</i> ) When the aboriginals first saw sheep, they compared them to white clouds ( <i>A.W. Reed</i> ); or “sheep” ( <i>S.E. Endacott, Grandpa Pencil – online</i> )

Mount Ommaney Drive	John Mansel OMMANNEY, nephew of Dr Simpson of Wolston, was killed when thrown from a horse near what is now known as Mt Ommaney. In 1966 also known in part as Kooringal Drive ( <i>BCC Archives</i> )
