SUMNER

**(established originally as a general industry industrial park
– “Plants Grow Well in Sumner Park”)**

Originally named by Queensland Place Names Board on 1 July 1969.

Name and boundaries confirmed by Minister for Survey and Valuation, Urban and Regional Affairs on 11 August 1975.

Boundary altered by the Minister for Natural Resources and Minister for Mines on 11 July 2003.

Suburb name from pioneer farmer in the area.

Many street names have an industrial influence.
